

COVID AWARE

If you have any symptoms of COVID-19, please do not come to the church but go home and self-isolate as per Government guidance.

In the car park, please be attentive to where others are parked and maintain a distance of at least two metres between you and the next person except if they live with you.

There is a limit to how many people we can accommodate in church please be patient, you may be asked to wait outside until a steward is ready.

Please follow the stewards' instructions – they are there to provide guidance and support, but they cannot provide physical help.

Please sanitise your hands when you come into the church – and maintain good handwashing discipline at all times. Hand sanitiser is available as you enter the church. You may bring your own gloves or mask, if you wish to wear them, as we observe the 2 metre rule.

Please confirm to the stewards your name and telephone number, which may be required by NHS Test & Trace.

Your offertory collection can be left in the basket as you leave the church – the collection will not be taken up during Mass.

Please maintain social distancing in the church by remaining two metres from others (except if they live with you) by not stepping past anyone in the aisles or between the benches, by following the one-way system, and by sitting where the green tick indicates that you may sit. The green ticks indicate spaces where up to three people within the same social 'bubble' may sit.

If you are a larger family unit (i.e. more than 3 people) please let the stewards know and they will arrange seating for you.

Please maintain a prayerful silence inside the church, but feel free to ask the stewards if you need anything. At least 2 stewards will be available at all times, and they can be identified by their blue sash.

Please bring your own prayer books/bibles, etc – there will be none available.

If you would like to light a candle in the Mary Chapel, please do so as you leave the church.

Please light a candle from the one that is already lit on the stand.

There will be one toilet available, however it will be on a 'one in' and 'one out' system and you will be requested to close the lid and flush the toilet on exit. A wash basin, soap and paper towels will be available to wash and dry your hands.

Holy Communion will be distributed by the Celebrant alone and under one kind, the Sacred Host. Once you have received the Sacred Host please leave the church by the designated exit following the one-way system.

Anyone who does not follow these instructions may be asked to leave, as we have to follow legislation in force and such guidance that is issued by Her Majesty's Government and the Bishops' Conference of England & Wales, together with any directions given by Bishop Patrick.

BOOKINGS FOR HOLY MASS

St Augustine Webster Church HOLY MASS ON SUNDAY will be by pre-booking only bookings for Holy Mass are to be by phone (07753925651) between 11am and 12 noon on a Friday and a Saturday. **Please do not leave a text message or voicemail.**

St Mary's Church HOLY MASS (The First of Sunday) ON SATURDAY 6.00pm, SUNDAY 11.00am will be by pre booking only. You can do this by telephone only between 10am and 12 noon on a Saturday morning only. The number to call is **07901670891**. **Please do not leave a text message or voicemail.**

You will be asked to give your name and telephone number, these will be kept and given to the stewards to confirm your place before you can access the church.

You will be required to wear a face covering and sanitise your hands on entry. A steward will show you to your seat. and Assist you when you leave. Your details will be kept for track and trace for 21 days prior to destruction.

Individuals/family groups ideally will come to only one Sunday Mass each Sunday. To come twice means someone else can't. No one not pre booked should be in either church during Sunday Mass. Please do not just turn up to either church for Sunday Mass unless you have booked a place. This is due to a limit on the numbers permissible in the church.

WEEKDAY HOLY MASS You do not need to book, but you will be required to give your name and contact details to the steward, wear a face covering and sanitise your hands before you enter. Attendance will be on a strictly first come first served basis and you may be refused entry when capacity is reached.

Sunday, The Lord's Day...

"The Lord's Day — as Sunday was called from Apostolic times — has always been accorded special attention in the history of the Church because of its close connection with the very core of the Christian mystery. In fact, in the weekly reckoning of time Sunday recalls the day of Christ's Resurrection. It is *Easter* which returns week by week, celebrating Christ's victory over sin and death, the fulfilment in him of the first creation and the dawn of 'the new creation' (cf. *2 Cor* 5:17). It is the day which recalls in grateful adoration the world's first day and looks forward in active hope to "the last day", when Christ will come in glory (cf. *Acts* 1:11; *1 Th* 4:13-17) and all things will be made new (cf. *Rev* 21:5).....

Unfortunately, when Sunday loses its fundamental meaning and becomes merely part of a 'weekend', it can happen that people stay locked within a horizon so limited that they can no longer see 'the heavens'. Hence, though ready to celebrate, they are really incapable of doing so....

The duty to keep Sunday holy, especially by sharing in the Eucharist and by relaxing in a spirit of Christian joy and fraternity, is easily understood if we consider the many different aspects of this day upon which the present Letter will focus our attention...

From a liturgical point of view, in fact, holy days begin with First Vespers. Consequently, the liturgy of what is sometimes called the 'Vigil Mass' is in effect the 'festive' Mass of Sunday, at which the celebrant is required to preach the homily and recite the Prayer of the Faithful.....

Therefore, also in the particular circumstances of our own time, Christians will naturally strive to ensure that civil legislation respects their duty to keep Sunday holy. In any case, they are obliged in conscience to arrange their Sunday rest in a way which allows them to take part in the Eucharist, refraining from work and activities which are incompatible with the sanctification of the Lord's Day, with its characteristic joy and necessary rest for spirit and body."

Saint Pope John Paul II in "*DIES DOMINI*" – a recommended read!

The Mass on Saturday is not a Vigil, but as The Pope wrote, but the (First) Festive Mass of Sunday. With it Sunday has begun! As The Pope hints some, wrongly, call it a Vigil Mass.
