I am spending an average £200 a month to keep up with demand, but finding it difficult to find the usual supplies in stock at Tesco. Please keep us and our customers in your prayers Thank you Penny"

It is a chance to welcome a new priest as he makes certain public oaths, and formally takes on a role given to him as a co-worker of The Diocesan Bishop. The Bishop is the chief pastor and teacher in the Diocese. The ceremony is a public Parish event, and not a personal celebration of the Priest. It is not for him to invite people to it, but in a sense The Parishioners invite The Parishioners, and others to the event.

It is an Induction to a joint Parish Ministry: St Augustine Webster, Barton, and St Mary's Brigg. Fr Michael's colleagues, in his external role, have been invited, and other clergy, and ecumenical guests, have received an informal invitation. It may be that some of his family attend. It is at 7.15 pm in St Mary's Church, Brigg. All are welcome. It is the feast of St Matthew, Apostle and Evangelist. (A suggestion has been made we have refreshments for Parishioners in Barton after Mass at a future date. Although it is hoped many will come to Brigg on 21st September.) Fr will not be around on the original date suggested!
